This Dutch video on the church in <u>Oudshoorn</u> (<u>Netherlands</u>) contains images of armorial stained glass windows which you may like. Images start at 0.58. These windows survived the heraldic purge carried out by the revolutionary régime which seized power in the Netherlands in 1795.
